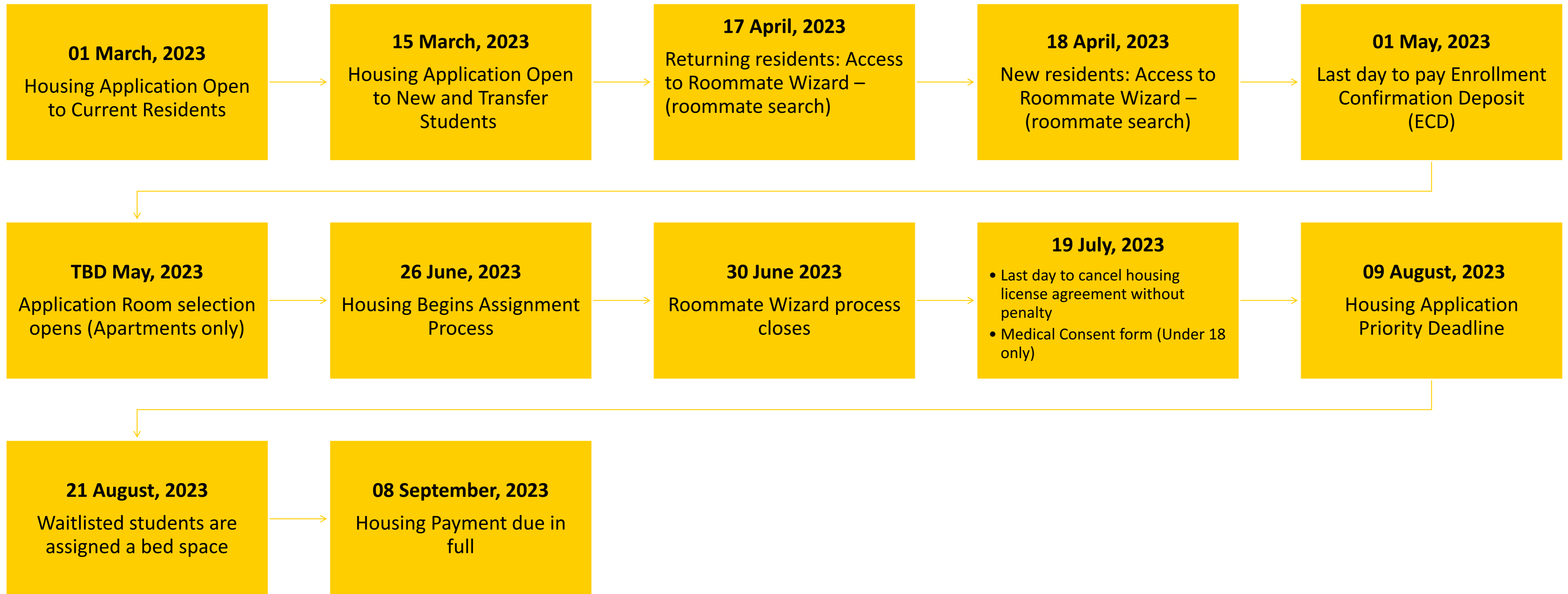


The Housing Application Process allows students the opportunity to apply for housing for the upcoming academic year.

The housing application opened on March 01, 2023 for returning students and March 15, 2023 for new students.

Students will be able to choose roommates April 17, 2023 for returning students and April 18, 2023 for new students.

Housing Selection: Important Dates



Before You Apply for Housing

- Make sure you're in good academic, judicial and financial standing
- Review the different interest and learning communities you may want to join
- Identify which community you wish to live in and qualify for
- Determine your preferred room type
- If you want a specific person as a roommate/housemate, confirm their interest – make sure both your preferred room type matches on your application
 - If you do not have a specific roommate in mind, you will have a chance to search for a roommate later

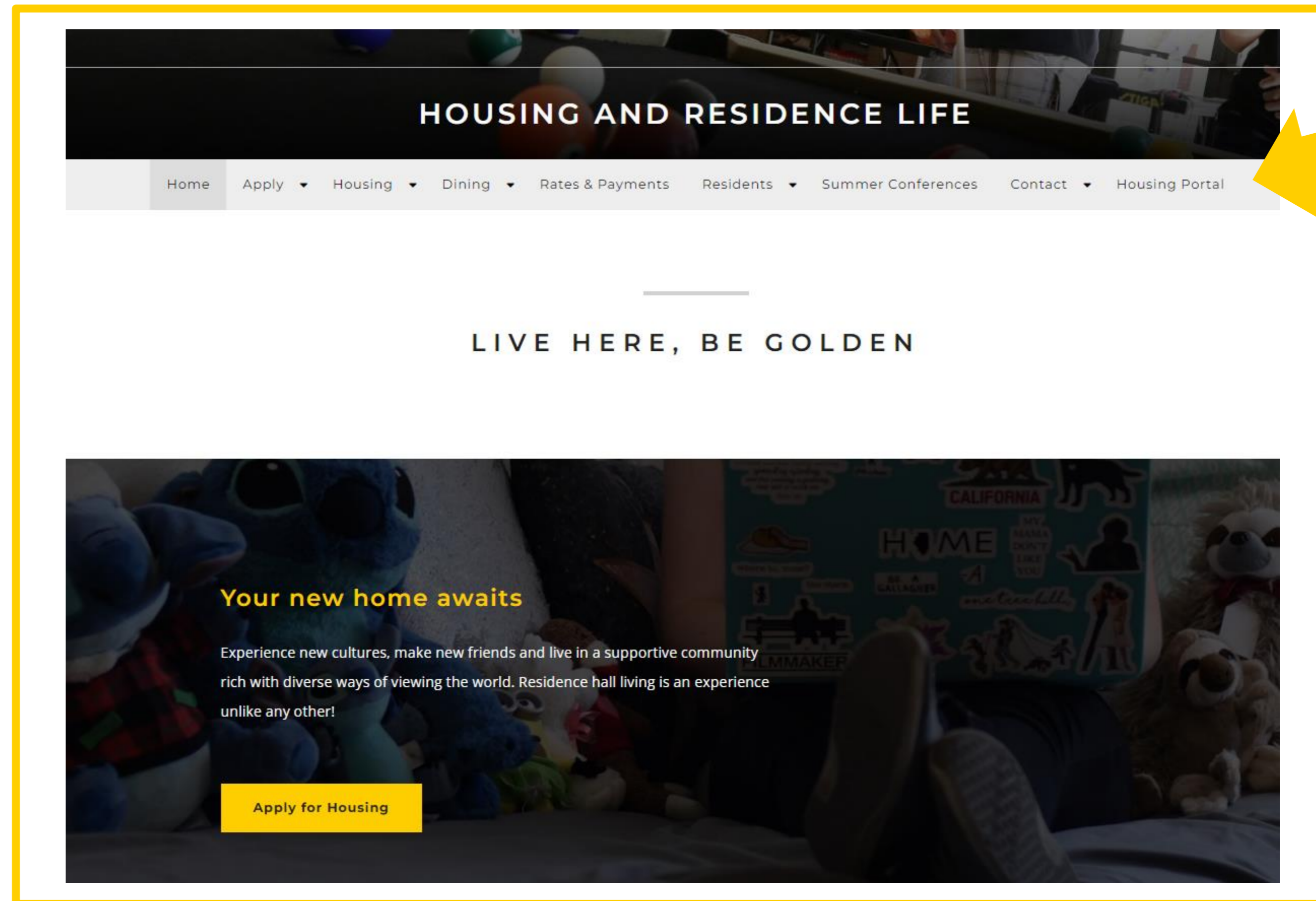
Before You Apply for Housing *Continued*

- If you have a health condition or disability that requires a housing accommodation, register with the Office for Students with Disabilities (OSD) for a housing recommendation; includes requests for a service or emotional support animal
- **Prepare for the housing payment of \$40**



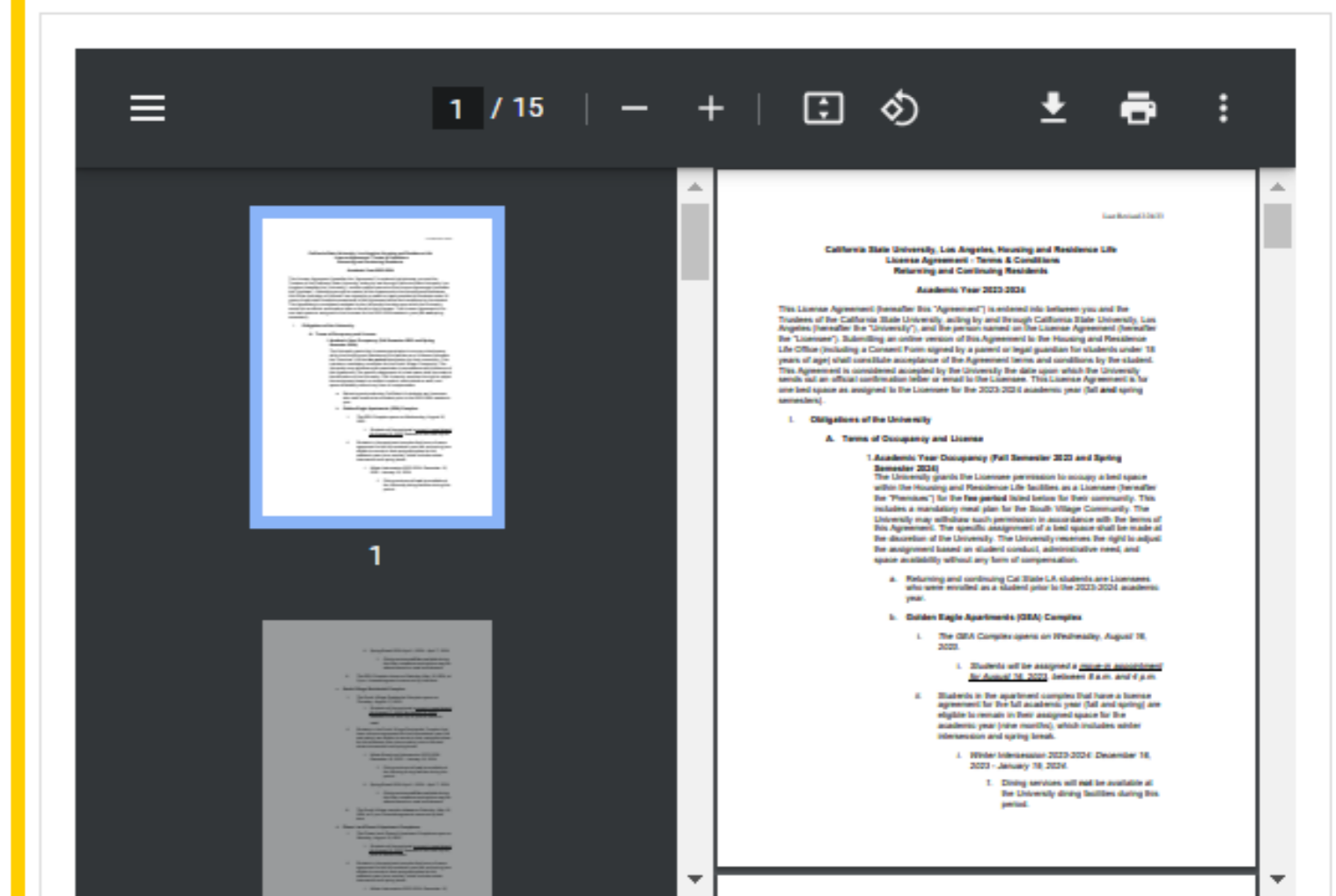

Meningococcal B Info Form

All undergraduate and graduate students are required to adhere to Executive Order (EO 803). As per the CSU Immunization Requirements, Meningococcal Disease (Serogroups A, C, Y, W-135) are required. However, Meningococcal B (Meningitis B or Bacterial Meningitis) is not required by the CSU, nor is it required to live on campus. The purpose of this section is to provide you with information regarding these infections and available vaccines.

Per California state law, every New Admit (new student) to the university must be provided with information about Meningitis B. Completion of this form indicates that you have been made aware of the Meningococcal B (Meningitis B or Bacterial Meningitis) disease and informs us as to whether or not you intend to receive the meningococcal vaccine.

Health Mandate Occupancy Requirements

You will be responsible for tracking the payment deadlines and financial aid disbursements. The Cashier's Office will send out at least one invoice per semester. The Cashier's Office will also send late notices if payments are missed, which will include a late fee. Housing staff are available to assist you with any questions.

Payment Options:

Housing fees are billed to student accounts each semester. Fees for fall will be posted in July. Fees for spring will be posted in November.

Fall payment deadline: September 8, 2023

Spring payment deadline: February 9, 2024

Housing payments paid-in-full are required by the due date outlined above. Late payments are subject to a \$20 monthly fee until the balance is paid. Depending on the meal plan selected, students may have a higher billing rate. Due dates are firm, even those that fall on weekends or holidays.

Payment Plans: Students may request a payment plan as soon as charges are posted to their GET account by submitting a payment plan request form, which can be found on the Housing Portal. In some cases, payment plans are not possible.

Financial Aid: Financial Aid can be applied to your housing fees. You should calculate all of your expenses, including tuition, fees, incidentals such as books, and housing costs to make the best decision in accepting the various types of financial aid that are being offered to you. Please keep in mind that housing fees are covered only after other fees have been satisfied. Full and prompt compliance with all Financial Aid & Scholarships office requests for information and response is advised to ensure a timely financial aid award and disbursement.

These are important payment deadlines to keep in mind. Students also have an option to set up a payment plan. All this information can be found [on your GET account](#) once charges are posted.


